

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



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#### Lordship Salvation Defined

"Lordship Salvation refers to the belief which says the sinner who wants to be saved must <u>not only</u> trust Christ as his substitute for sin, but must <u>also</u> surrender every area of his life to the complete control



# John 1:47-48- Jesus saw Nathanael coming to Him, and \*said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" <sup>48</sup> Nathanael \*said to Him, "How do You know me?" Jesus answered and said to him, "**Before Philip called you, when you** were under the fig tree, I saw you."

Philip. 2:5-8- Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but **emptied Himself**, taking the form of a bond-servant, *and* being made in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup> Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death <sup>[h]</sup>on a cross.

John 1:14- And <u>the Word became flesh</u>, and <sup>[k]</sup>dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of <sup>[1]</sup>the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

1 Tim. 2:4-who desires <u>all men</u> to be saved and to come to the <sup>[a]</sup>knowledge of the truth

2 Peter 3:9-The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for <u>all</u> to come to repentance

Acts 16:30-31-and after he brought them out, he said, "<u>Sirs</u>, what must I do to be saved?"<sup>31</sup> They said, "Believe in the <u>Lord</u> Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household."

Barger-"Isa" in no way represents the Jesus of the Bible but is instead the false Jesus of the Qur'an (Koran) and the Muslim Hadith. "Isa" (pronounced "eee-sa") is the Islamic Jesus who was but a prophet and who certainly did not experience a sacrificial death on a cross let alone resurrect from the dead. In fact, in Islam the prophet Isa is actually the destroyer of Christianity - not it's Savior. Obviously, this is simply NOT the same Jesus as is Yeshua

Lev. 24:16- Moreover, the one who blasphemes the name of the LORD shall surely be put to death; all the congregation shall certainly **stone him**. The alien as well as the native, when he blasphemes the Name, shall be put to death.

John 10:30-33-<u>I and the Father are <sup>[a]</sup>one."<sup>31</sup> The Jews picked</u> <u>up stones again to stone Him</u>. <sup>32</sup> Jesus answered them, "I showed you many good works from the Father; for which of them are you <u>stoning Me</u>?" <sup>33</sup> The Jews answered Him, "<u>For a</u> <u>good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy; and</u> <u>because You, being a man, make Yourself out *to be* God."</u>

John 8:58-59- Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham <sup>[q]</sup>was born, <u>I am</u>." <sup>59</sup> Therefore they picked up <u>stones</u> to throw at Him, but Jesus <sup>[r]</sup>hid Himself and went out of the temple.

John 1:40-42- <u>One of the two who heard John speak and</u> <u>followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.</u> <sup>41</sup> He <u>\*found first his own brother Simon and \*said to him, "We</u> <u>have found the Messiah" (which translated means <sup>[ab]</sup>Christ).</u> <sup>42</sup> He brought him to Jesus. Matt. 4:18-22- Now as Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon who was called <u>Peter</u>, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. <sup>19</sup> And He \*said to them, "<sup>[h]</sup>Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." <sup>20</sup> Immediately they left their nets and followed Him. <sup>21</sup> Going on from there He saw two other brothers, <sup>[i]</sup>James the *son* of Zebedee, and <sup>[i]</sup>John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and He called them. <sup>22</sup> Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed Him.

John 1:34-I myself have seen, and have testified that this is the **Son of God** 

John 1:49-Nathanael answered Him, "Rabbi, You are the <u>Son of</u> <u>God</u>; You are the King of Israel."

John 5:25-Truly, truly, I say to you, an hour is coming and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the **Son of God**, and those who hear will live

John 10:36- do you say of Him, whom the Father sanctified and sent into the world, 'You are blaspheming,' because I said, 'I am the **Son of God**'?

John 6:69-We have believed and have come to know that You are the **Holy One of God**.

John 11:11-14-This He said, and after that He \*said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I go, so that I may awaken him out of sleep." <sup>12</sup> The disciples then said to Him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will <sup>[a]</sup>recover." <sup>13</sup> Now Jesus had spoken of his death, but they thought that He was speaking of <sup>[b]</sup>literal sleep. <sup>14</sup> So Jesus then said to them plainly, "<u>Lazarus</u> <u>is dead</u>,

John 5:28-30-Do not marvel at this; for an hour is coming, in which all who are in the tombs will hear His voice, <sup>29</sup> and will come forth; those who did the good *deeds* to a resurrection of

life, those who committed the evil *deeds* to a resurrection of judgment.<sup>30</sup> "I can do nothing on My own initiative. As I hear, I judge; and <u>My judgment is just</u>, because I do not seek My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me.

John 5:27-and He <u>gave Him authority to execute judgment</u>, because He is <sup>[f]</sup>*the* Son of Man

John 3:16- For God so loved the <u>world</u>, that He gave His <sup>[e]</sup>only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.

John 20:16- Jesus \*said to her, "<u>Mary</u>!" She turned and \*said to Him in <sup>[a]</sup>Hebrew, "Rabboni!" (which means, Teacher).
