



1 Tim. 4:14-Do not neglect the spiritual gift within you, which was bestowed on you through prophetic utterance with the laying on of hands by the presbytery.

Eph 4:11-16-And He gave some *as* apostles, and some *as* prophets, and some *as* evangelists, and some *as* pastors and teachers, ¹² for the equipping of the ^[d]saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ; ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the ^[e]knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature ^[f]which belongs to the fullness of Christ. ¹⁴ ^[g]As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness ^[h]in deceitful scheming; ¹⁵ but ^[i]speaking the truth in love, ^[i]we are to grow up in all *aspects* into Him who is the head, *even* Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together ^[k]by what every joint supplies, according to

- the ^[l]proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love.
- 2 Tim 3:16-17-All Scripture is ^[h]inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for ^[i]training in righteousness; ¹⁷ so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.
- 1 Cor. 4:2-In this case, moreover, it is required of <u>stewards</u> that one be found <u>trustworthy</u>.

- Matt. 25:14-15, 24-28-"For *it is* just like a man *about* to go on a journey, who called his own slaves and entrusted his possessions to them. ¹⁵ To one he gave five ^[a]talents, to another, two, and to another, one, each according to his own ability; and he went on his journey..._"And the one also who had received the one talent came up and said, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow and gathering where you scattered no *seed*. ²⁵ **And I was afraid**, and went away and hid your talent in the ground. See, you have what is yours.' ²⁶ "But his master answered and said to him, 'You wicked, lazy slave, you knew

that I reap where I did not sow and gather where I scattered no *seed*. ²⁷ Then you ought to have put my money ^[d]in the bank, and on my arrival I would have received my *money* back with interest. ²⁸ Therefore take away the talent from him, and give it to the one who has the ten talents.'
