

Iranian school textbooks reflect the strategy and tactics of the Ayatollahs, much more authentically than speeches, interviews, diplomatic statements and conversations conducted by President Rouhani and Foreign Minister Zarif."







### 2. What are the true causes of terrorism?

Prov. 14:12- There is a way *which seems* right to a man, But its end is the way of death.

### 3. What does not deter terrorism?

Eccles 8:11-Because the sentence against an evil deed is not executed quickly, therefore the hearts of the sons of men among them are given fully to do evil.

### 4. What effectively deters terrorism?

Rom. 13:3-4- For rulers are not a cause of fear for good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good and you will have praise from the same; <sup>4</sup> for it is a minister of God to you for good. But if you do what is evil, be afraid; for it does not bear the sword for nothing; for it is a minister of God, an avenger who brings wrath on the one who practices evil.

1 Pet. 2:13-14-Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether to a king as the one in authority, <sup>14</sup> or to governors as sent <sup>[p]</sup> by him for the punishment of evildoers and the praise of those who do right.

"The 10 U.S. sailors who were briefly detained by the Iranian military last week were held at gunpoint and had a verbal exchange with Iranian personnel before they were released, the U.S. military said Monday... The U.S. sailors, who were aboard two patrol craft, were detained by Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) on January 12 when they inadvertently entered Iranian territorial waters. They were released the next day after being held for about 15 hours."

On April 5, 1986 three people were killed and around 230 injured when *La Belle* discothèque was bombed in West Berlin. The entertainment venue was commonly frequented by <u>United States</u> soldiers, and two of the dead and 79 of the injured were American servicemen...<u>Libya</u> was accused of sponsoring the bombing by the US government, and US President <u>Ronald Reagan</u> ordered retaliatory strikes on <u>Tripoli</u> and <u>Benghazi</u> in Libya ten days later. The strikes reportedly killed at least 15 people, including Colonel Gaddafi's adopted daughter. A 2001

trial in the US found that the bombing had been 'planned by the Libyan secret service and the Libyan Embassy.'

Because of the consistent application of then United States' President Ronald Reagan's "peace through strength" doctrine against sponsors of terrorism, Gaddafi remained largely silent and non-assertive in the subsequent decades.

Strobe Talbot-"The Soviet Union Collapsed: the Cold War ended almost overwhelmingly because of the internal contradictions or pressures within the Soviet Union and the Soviet System itself. And even if Jimmy Carter had been elected and been followed by Walter Mondale, something like what we have now seen probably would have happened."

Oleg Kalugin (former KGB general) - American policy in the 1980s was a catalyst for the collapse of the Soviet Union.

Yegenny Novikov (Sr. staff member of the Soviet Communist Party Central Committee) - the Reagan polices "were a major factor in the demise of the Soviet system."

Alexander Bessmertnykh (former Soviet foreign minister) - told Princeton conference attendees that programs like the Strategic Defense Initiative accelerated the decline of the Soviet Union.

Matt. 22:39-The second is like it, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.'

Exod. 20:13-"You shall not murder."

Deut 20:1-When you go out to battle against your enemies and see horses and chariots *and* people more numerous than you, do not be afraid of them; for the LORD your God, who brought you up from the land of Egypt, is with you.

Matt. 5:39-But I say to you, do not resist an evil person; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also.

Luke 22:36-And He said to them, "But now, <sup>[e]</sup>whoever has a money belt is to take it along, likewise also a bag, and <sup>[f]</sup>whoever has no sword is to sell his <sup>[g]</sup>coat and buy one.

Luke 3:14-Some soldiers were questioning him, saying, "And what about us, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Do not take money from anyone by force, or accuse anyone falsely, and be content with your wages."

### 5. Can the government go too far in deterring terrorism?

Luke 14:31-Or what king, when he sets out to meet another king in battle, will not first sit down and consider whether he is strong enough with ten thousand *men* to encounter the one coming against him with twenty thousand?

Deut. 20:10-12-<sup>10</sup> "When you approach a city to fight against it, you shall <sup>[f]</sup> offer it terms of peace. <sup>11</sup> If it <sup>[g]</sup> agrees to make peace with you and opens to you, then all the people who are found in it shall become your forced labor and shall serve you.

<sup>12</sup> However, if it does not make peace with you, but makes war against you, then you shall besiege it.

Deut. 20:13-14-<sup>13</sup> When the LORD your God gives it into your hand, you shall strike all the <sup>[h]</sup>men in it with the edge of the sword. <sup>14</sup> Only the women and the children and the animals and all that is in the city, all its spoil, you shall take as booty for yourself; and you shall <sup>[i]</sup>use the spoil of your enemies which the LORD your God has given you.

Josh. 2:1-Then Joshua the son of Nun sent two men as <u>spies</u> secretly from Shittim, saying, "Go, view the land, especially Jericho." So they went and came into the house of a harlot whose name was Rahab, and <sup>[a]</sup>lodged there.

Prov. 13:24-He who withholds his <sup>[s]</sup>rod hates his son, But he who loves him <sup>[t]</sup>disciplines him diligently.
