### <u>2</u>

Jer. 25:11-12-This whole land will be a desolation and a horror, and these nations will serve the king of Babylon <u>seventy</u> <u>years</u>. Then it will be when <u>seventy years</u> are completed I will punish the king of Babylon and that nation, declares the LORD, for their iniquity, and the land of the Chaldeans; and I will make it an everlasting desolation.

Jer. 29:10-For thus says the LORD, 'When <u>seventy years</u> have been completed for Babylon, I will visit you and fulfill My good word to you, to bring you back to this place.

1 Chron. 12:32-Of the sons of Issachar, men who understood the times, with knowledge of what Israel should do, their chiefs *were* two hundred; and all their kinsmen *were* at their command.

Acts 6:4-But we will devote ourselves to **prayer** and to the diministry of the **word**.

Exod. 20:8-11-Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. <sup>9</sup> Six days you shall labor and do all your work, <sup>10</sup> but the seventh day is a sabbath of the LORD your God; *in it* you shall not do any work, you or your son or your daughter, your male or your female servant or your cattle or your sojourner who <sup>[e]</sup> stays with you. <sup>11</sup> For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and made it holy..

Lev. 25:1-5-The LORD then spoke to Moses [a] at Mount Sinai, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Speak to the sons of Israel and say to them, 'When you come into the land which I shall give you, then the land shall have a sabbath to the LORD. <sup>3</sup> Six years you shall sow your field, and six years you shall prune your vineyard and gather in its crop, <sup>4</sup> but during the seventh year the land shall have a sabbath rest, a sabbath to the LORD; you shall not sow your field nor prune your vineyard. <sup>5</sup> Your harvest's [b] aftergrowth you shall not reap, and your grapes of untrimmed vines you shall not gather; the land shall have a sabbatical year.

Lev. 26:33-35-You, however, I will scatter among the nations and will draw out a sword after you, as your land becomes desolate and your cities become waste.<sup>34</sup> 'Then the land will <sup>[k]</sup>enjoy its sabbaths all the days of the desolation, while you are

in your enemies' land; then the land will rest and <sup>[l]</sup>enjoy its sabbaths. <sup>35</sup> All the days of *its* desolation it will observe the rest which it did not observe on your sabbaths, while you were living on it.

2 Chron 36:20-21- Those who had escaped from the sword he carried away to Babylon; and they were servants to him and to his sons until the rule of the kingdom of Persia, <sup>21</sup> to fulfill the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had enjoyed its sabbaths. All the days of its desolation it kept sabbath <sup>[d]</sup>until seventy years were complete.

### <u>3</u>

Matt. 6:12-And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

1 John 1:9-If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Ps. 66:18-If I [i]regard wickedness in my heart, The Lord [i]will not [k]hear.

1 Peter 3:7-You husbands in the same way, live with *your wives* in an understanding way, as with <sup>[c]</sup>someone weaker, since she is a woman; and show her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered.

2 Chron. 7:14- and My people <sup>[d]</sup>who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

Hos. 4:1-Listen to the word of the LORD, O sons of Israel, For the LORD has a case against the inhabitants of the land, Because there is no [a]faithfulness or [b]kindness Or knowledge of God in the land.

2 Chron 36:16-but they *continually* mocked the messengers of God, despised His words and scoffed at His prophets, until the wrath of the LORD arose against His people, until there was no remedy.

Matt. 23:34-35-Therefore, behold, I am sending you prophets and wise men and scribes; some of them you will kill and crucify, and some of them you will scourge in your synagogues, and persecute from city to city, <sup>35</sup> so that upon you may fall *the guilt of* all the righteous blood shed on earth, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, whom you murdered between the <sup>[ab]</sup>temple and the altar.

### <u>7</u>

Dt. 28:49-50-The LORD will bring a nation against you from afar, from the end of the earth, as the eagle swoops down, a nation whose language you shall not understand, <sup>50</sup> a nation of fierce countenance who will have no respect for the old, nor show favor to the young.

Dt. 28:64-Moreover, the LORD will scatter you among all peoples, from one end of the earth to the other end of the earth; and there you shall serve other gods, wood and stone, which you or your fathers have not known.

Exod. 2:24-So God heard their groaning; and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
