Dan. 10:21- However, I will tell you what is inscribed in **the writing of truth**. Yet there is no one who stands firmly with me against these *forces* except Michael your prince.

Dan. 10:20- Then he said, “Do you understand why I came to you? But I shall now return to fight against the prince of Persia; so I am going forth, and behold, **the prince of Greece is about to come**.

Dan. 8:5-8- While I was observing, behold, a male goat was coming from the west over the surface of the whole earth without touching the ground; and the goat *had* a conspicuous horn between his eyes. ⁶ He came up to the ram that had the two horns, which I had seen standing in front of the canal, and rushed at him in his mighty wrath. ⁷ I saw him come beside the ram, and he was enraged at him; and he struck the ram and shattered his two horns, and the ram had no strength to withstand him. So he hurled him to the ground and trampled on him, and there was none to rescue the ram from his power. ⁸ Then the male goat magnified himself exceedingly...

Gal. 4:4- But **when the fullness of the time came**, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law

Matt. 26:47-50- ⁴⁷ While He was still speaking, behold, Judas, one of the twelve, came up accompanied by a large crowd with swords and clubs, *who came* from the chief priests and elders of the people. ⁴⁸ Now he who was betraying Him gave them a sign,

saying, “Whomever I kiss, He is the one; seize Him.”

⁴⁹ Immediately Judas went to Jesus and said, “Hail, Rabbi!” and kissed Him. ⁵⁰ And Jesus said to him, “Friend, *do* what you have come for.” Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and seized Him.

John 13:18-¹⁸ I do not speak of all of you. I know the ones I have chosen; but *it is* that the Scripture may be fulfilled, ‘HE WHO EATS MY BREAD HAS LIFTED UP HIS HEEL AGAINST ME.’

Dan. 8:8-⁸ Then the male goat magnified *himself* exceedingly. **But as soon as he was mighty, the large horn was broken;** and in its place there came up four conspicuous *horns* toward the four winds of heaven.

Dan. 7:6-After this I kept looking, and behold, another one, like a leopard, which had on its back **four wings of a bird;** the beast also had four heads, and dominion was given to it.

Dan. 8:8-⁸ Then the male goat magnified *himself* exceedingly. But as soon as he was mighty, the large horn was broken; and in its place **there came up four conspicuous horns toward the four winds of heaven.**

Dan. 8:22-The broken *horn* and the **four horns that arose in its place represent four kingdoms which will arise from his nation,** although not with his power.

Dan. 8:22-The broken *horn* and the four *horns that* arose in its place *represent* four kingdoms *which* will arise from *his* nation, **although not with his power.**

Matt. 12:25- And knowing their thoughts Jesus said to them, **“Any kingdom divided against itself is laid waste; and any city or house divided against itself will not stand.**

1 Cor. 6:7- Actually, then, **it is already a defeat for you,** that you have lawsuits with one another. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be defrauded?
