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

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


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### **Revelation 21**

He measured the city with the rod and found it to be [1500 miles] in length, and as wide and high as it is long. <sup>17</sup> He measured its wall and it was 144 cubits thick, by man's measurement, which the angel was using.

- <u>Swete</u>: "Such dimensions defy imagination and are permissible only in the language of symbolism."
- <u>Barnes</u>: "Of course, this must preclude all idea of there being such a city literally in Palestine...this cannot be understood literally; and the very idea of a literal fulfillment of this shows the absurdity of that method of interpretation...this cannot be taken literally; and an attempt to explain all of this literally would show that that method of interpreting the Apocalypse is impracticable."
