But Judas Iscariot, one of His disciples, who was intending to [b] betray Him, \*said, 5 "Why was this perfume not sold for [c] three hundred denarii and given to poor people?"

6 Now he said this, not because he was concerned about the poor, but because he was a thief, and as he had the money box, he used to pilfer what was put into it.

Philip. 1:15-17-15 Some, to be sure, are preaching Christ even from envy and strife, but some also from good will; 16 the latter do it out of love, knowing that I am appointed for the defense of the gospel; 17 the former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition rather than from pure motives, thinking to cause me distress in my imprisonment.

1 Sam. 16:7- But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for [b]God sees not as man sees, for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

Jer. 17:9-The <u>heart is more deceitful</u> than all else And is desperately sick; Who can understand it?

Prov. 4:23-Keep your heart with all diligence, For out of it *spring* the issues of life (NKJV).

John 15:5-6-I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup> If anyone does not abide in Me, he is thrown

away as a branch and dries up; and they gather them, and cast them into the fire and they are burned.

Gen. 22:2-He said, "Take now your son, your <u>only son</u>, whom you love, Isaac, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I will tell you."
