





The Latin. Coptic or Memphitic, and Arminian, which are of great value, contain it."

And to discredit it, simply and only because it does not appear in that one single Codex of Alexandria, is most unreasonable and unjust to the weight of authority for its retention. Dr. Tregelles, on full examination, was firmly convinced of its right to a place in the text, before the Codex Sinatiticus appeared; and the presence of this right in that MS, ought to settle the question of its genuineness forever. The evidences from the context, also argue powerfully for a construction which necessarily embraces it, whether expressed or not. We regard it as indubitably genuine."

Rev. 1:20-As for the mystery of the seven stars which you saw in My right hand, and the seven golden lampstands: the seven

stars are the angels of the seven churches, and <u>the</u> <u>seven lampstands are the seven churches</u>.

Rev. 4:5-Out from the throne come flashes of lightning and sounds and peals of thunder. And there were **seven lamps of fire burning before the throne**, which are the seven Spirits of God.

Dan. 12:1-2-Now at that time Michael, the great prince who stands *guard* over the sons of your people, will arise.
