Rev. 22:15-Outside are the <u>dogs</u> and the sorcerers and the immoral persons and the murderers and the idolaters, and everyone who loves and practices lying.

<u>3</u>

Rom. 2:28-29-²⁸ For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh. ²⁹ But he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that which is of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter; and his praise is not from men, but from God.

John 4:24-God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.

5-6

Gen. 17:12-And every male among you who is **eight days old** shall be circumcised throughout your generations, a *servant* who is born in the house or who is bought with money from any foreigner, who is not of your descendants.

- Rom. 3:2-Great in every respect. First of all, that they were entrusted with the oracles of God.
- Rom. 9:4-5-⁴ who are Israelites, to whom belongs the adoption as sons, and the glory and the covenants and the giving of the Law and the *temple* service and the promises, ⁵ whose are the fathers, and from whom is the Christ according to the flesh, who is over all, God blessed forever. Amen.
- Acts 22:3-I am a Jew, born in Tarsus of Cilicia, but brought up in this city, **educated under Gamaliel**, strictly according to the law of our fathers, being zealous for God just as you all are today.
- Acts 7:58-When they had driven him out of the city, they *began* stoning *him*; and the witnesses laid aside their robes at the feet of a young man named Saul.
- Acts 8:1-Saul was in hearty agreement with putting him to death. And on that day a great persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles.
- 1 Cor. 15:9-For I am the least of the apostles, and not fit to be called an apostle, because I **persecuted** the church of God.
- Eph. 3:8-To me, <u>the very least of all saints</u>, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unfathomable riches of Christ.
- Philip. 3:6-as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to the righteousness which is in the Law, found blameless.
- 1 Tim. 1:12-15-¹² I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because He considered me faithful, putting me into service, ¹³ even though I was formerly a blasphemer and

a persecutor and a violent aggressor. Yet I was shown mercy because I acted ignorantly in unbelief; ¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord was more than abundant, with the faith and love which are *found* in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵ It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost *of all*.

Rom. 10:2-For I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but not in accordance with knowledge.

John 16:2-They will make you outcasts from the synagogue, but an hour is coming for everyone who kills you to think that he is offering service to God.

Gal. 2:21- I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness *comes* through the Law, then Christ died needlessly.

Gal. 5:13-For you were called to freedom, brethren; only *do* not *turn* your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

Rom. 13:14-But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh in regard to *its* lusts.

Rom. 6:12-Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts

Col. 3:2-Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth.

Acts 16:12- and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia, a *Roman* colony; and we were staying in this city for some days.

Heb. 11:10-for he was looking for the city which has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

1 Cor. 15:50-51-⁵⁰ Now I say this, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. ⁵¹ Behold, I tell you a mystery; we will not all sleep, but we will all be changed.

1 Cor. 15:53-54-⁵³ For this perishable must put on the imperishable, and this mortal must put on immortality. ⁵⁴ But when this perishable will have put on the imperishable, and this mortal will have put on immortality, then will come about the saying that is written, "DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP in victory.

- Gen. 3:19- By the sweat of your face You will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return.
- 2 Cor. 4:16-Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day.
- Matt. 28:18-And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth."

- John 13:35-By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."
- John 17:23- I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me, and loved them, even as You have loved Me.
- 1 Cor. 6:7-Actually, then, it is already a defeat for you, that you have lawsuits with one another. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be defrauded?
- Eph. 4:2-3-2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing tolerance for one another in love, 3 being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.
- Philip. 2:3-4-³ Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; ⁴ do not *merely* look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.
- Philip. 2:5-11-⁵ Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, *and* being made in the likeness of men. ⁸ Being found in

appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus EVERY KNEE WILL BOW, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

John 17:17-Sanctify them in the **truth**; Your word is truth.

John 17:19-For their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in **truth**.
