

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When is the Rapture?

7 Arguments Favoring the Pre-Tribulation View

- 1. Tribulation's purpose concerns Israel (Jer 30:7; Dan 9:24)
- 2. No biblical reference to the church on earth during the Tribulation period (Rev 4-22)
- 3. Church is promised an exemption from divine wrath (1 Thess 1:10; 5:9; Rom 5:9; Rev 3:10; 6:17)
- 4. Rapture is imminent (1 Cor 15:51; 1 Thess 4:15)
- 5. Rapture is a comfort (1 Thess 4:18)
- Antichrist cannot come to power until the restrainer is removed (2 Thess 2:6-7)
- 7. Symbolic parallels (2 Peter 2:5-9)

Luke 17:26-30

"²⁶ And just as it happened in the <u>days of Noah</u>, so it will be also in the days of the Son of Man: ²⁷ they were eating, they were drinking, they were marrying, they were being given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and the flood came and destroyed them all. ²⁸ It was the same as happened in the <u>days of Lot</u>: they were eating, they were drinking, they were buying, they were selling, they were planting, they were building; ²⁹ but on the day that Lot went out from Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all. ³⁰ It will be just the same on the day that the Son of Man is revealed."

- Noah protected before the flood (Gen 7:6-7)
- Lot taken before judgment upon Sodom (2 Pet 2:7; Gen 19:22)

Genesis 6:1-4

"1 Now it came about, when men began to multiply on the face of the land, and daughters were born to them, 2 that the sons of God saw that the daughters of men were beautiful; and they took wives for themselves, whomever they chose. 3 Then the Lord said, 'My Spirit shall not strive with man forever, because he also is flesh; nevertheless his days shall be one hundred and twenty years.' . . .



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Genesis 6:1-4

. . . 4 The Nephilim were on the earth in those days, and also afterward, when the sons of God came in to the daughters of men, and they bore children to them. Those were the mighty men who were of old, men of renown."

Genesis 6:5-7

"5 Then the Lord saw that the <u>wickedness</u> of man was great on the earth, and that <u>every</u> intent of the thoughts of his heart was <u>only evil continually</u>. ⁶ The <u>Lord was sorry</u> that He had made man on the earth, and He was <u>grieved</u> in His heart. ⁷ The Lord said, "<u>I will blot out man</u> whom I have created from the face of the land, from man to animals to creeping things and to birds of the sky; for I am sorry that I have made them."



Genesis 6:11-13

"11 Now the earth was <u>corrupt</u> in the sight of God, and the earth was filled with <u>violence</u>. 12 God looked on the earth, and behold, it was <u>corrupt</u>; for <u>all flesh had corrupted</u> their way upon the earth. 13 Then God said to Noah, "The end of all flesh has come before Me; for the earth is filled with <u>violence</u> because of them; and behold, I am about to destroy them with the earth."

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Genesis 5:18-24

"18 Jared lived one hundred and sixty-two years, and became the father of Enoch. ¹⁹ Then Jared lived eight hundred years after he became the father of Enoch, and he had *other* sons and daughters. ²⁰ So all the days of Jared were nine hundred and sixty-two years, and he died. ²¹ Enoch lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Methuselah. ²² Then Enoch walked with God three hundred years after ...




Genesis 5:18-24he became the father of Methuselah, and he had other sons and daughters. ²³ So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. ²⁴ Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him."

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Symbolic Parallels 2 Peter 2:4-9 Enoch taken before the flood (Gen 5:24) Noah protected before the flood (Gen 7:6-7) Lot taken before judgment upon Sodom (2 Pet 2:7; Gen 19:22)

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"Now Noah was six hundred years old when the flood of water came upon the earth. ⁷ Then Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him entered the ark because of the water of the flood."


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2 Peter 2:7-9 "7 and if He rescued righteous Lot, oppressed by the sensual conduct of unprincipled men 8 (for by what he saw and heard that righteous man, while living among them, felt his righteous soul tormented day after day by their lawless deeds), 9 then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from temptation, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment for the day of judgment."

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
