1 Cor 3:2-I gave you milk to drink, not solid food; for you were not yet able *to receive it*. Indeed, even now you are not yet able

Heb 5:13-14-For everyone who partakes *only* of milk is not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for he is an infant. But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil.

Gal 5:22-23-But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.

2 Pet 3:18-but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Eph 4:16-from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by what every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love.

2 Tim 1:7-For God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline.

2 Pet 1:12-Therefore, I will always be ready to remind you of these things, even though you *already* know *them*, and have been established in the truth which is present with *you*.

1 Cor 15:9-For I am the least of the apostles, and not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.

1 Tim 1:12-14-I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because He considered me faithful, putting me into service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent aggressor. Yet I was shown mercy because I acted ignorantly in unbelief; and the grace of our Lord was more than abundant, with the faith and love which are *found* in Christ Jesus.

Rev 1:6-and He has made us *to be* a kingdom, priests to His God and Father—to Him *be* the glory and the dominion forever and ever.

Gal 2:7-9-But on the contrary, seeing that I had been entrusted with the gospel to the uncircumcised, just as Peter *had been* to the circumcised (for He who effectually worked for Peter in *his* apostleship to the circumcised effectually worked for me also to the Gentiles), and recognizing the grace that had been given to me, James and Cephas and John, who were reputed to be pillars, gave to me and Barnabas the right

hand of fellowship, so that we *might go* to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised.

1 Thess 2:19-20-For who is our hope or joy or crown of exultation? Is it not even you, in the presence of our Lord Jesus at His coming? For you are our glory and joy.

2 Cor 10:17-But HE WHO BOASTS IS TO BOAST IN THE LORD

1 John 2:16-For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world.

Acts 19:10-This took place for two years, so that all who lived in Asia heard the word of the Lord, both Jews and Greeks.

2 Cor 12:12-The signs of a true apostle were performed among you with all perseverance, by signs and wonders and miracles.

Acts 1:8-but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth

1 Pet 5:13-She who is in Babylon, chosen together with you, sends you greetings

Rom 15:4-For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

Jude 24-25-Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, *be* glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.
