

1. My question has not so much to do with the timing of the Ezekiel 38 war as it does with the aftermath of the war: the timing of the burial of the bodies (for 7 months) and the birds feasting on their flesh. My understanding of what you have said is that you tend to place the Ezekiel 38 war near the beginning of the 7-year Tribulation period somewhere around the 1st and 2nd Seal Judgements, and the described aftermath of Ezekiel 39 at the end of the 7-year Tribulation period (which is when I think you say the birds will feast on the flesh of the dead bodies). [My reading of Ezek. 38] has me thinking the war / intended attack on Israel is stopped in its tracks on the mountains of Israel [by God] before it really gets started, and that God quickly destroys the would-be invaders (in a day so to speak). If this is the case, and the war does not drag on into the latter part of the 2nd half of the 7-year Tribulation period, my mind doesn't track with the idea of the flesh-eating feast taking place near the end of the 7 years. I am thinking the burial of the dead bodies (over a 7-month period) would start relatively soon after God destroys the invaders, and the birds feasting on their flesh would take place at the same time (while there are bodies still unburied available to eat). Can you please help me make sense of this? Where am I confused; what am I missing?
2. In Ezekiel 39:4-6, it says that Gog will die in the conflict. It also says in Ezekiel 39:11 that he will be buried there along with his horde. Like you, I believe Gog is the current or future leader of Russia, but I find it confusing that he would

die on the battlefield since leaders of countries no longer participate in the actual fighting as they did in ancient times. It would be the equivalent of Putin being on the front lines with his troops in Ukraine. Can you clear this up for me?

3. Are you able to elaborate more on your view as to why you think that the Ezekiel war coincides with the 2nd seal judgment?
4. What do you think of the view of the rapture and Ezekiel war occurring simultaneously as that also seems to be a common viewpoint of when the Ezekiel war will occur?
5. Is the Gog-Magog battle described in Ezekiel the same as the battle of Armageddon? If not, when does the Gog-Magog war occur in relation to the battle of Armageddon?
6. You mentioned there would be birth and death during the Millennium. Then when will the believers who die at that time resurrect? I know there will be two resurrections for believers at the Rapture and after the Tribulation. Did Bible mention the resurrection of believers who died during the Millennium?
7. Will Israel believe that the Anti-Christ is the Messiah for the 1st half of the Tribulation? I ask because if they will, why would the Abomination of Desolation be bad in their

eyes? If they believe he is "Jesus" then they wouldn't oppose worshipping him in the temple?
