Acts 2:46-Every day they continued to meet together in the **temple** courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts.

Acts 2:42-They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to **prayer**.

Acts 4:22-For the man who was miraculously healed was over **forty years old**.

John 5:1-9-1 After these things there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. 2 Now in Jerusalem, by the Sheep *Gate*, there is a pool which in Hebrew is called Bethesda, having five porticoes. 3 In these porticoes lay a multitude of those who were sick, blind, limping, or paralyzed. For an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool and stirred up the water; whoever then first, after the stirring up of the water, stepped in was made well from whatever disease with which he was afflicted. 5 Now a man was there who had been fill for thirtyeight years. 6 Jesus, upon seeing this man lying there and knowing that he had already been in that condition for a long time, said to him, "Do you want to get well?" ⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, but while I am coming, another steps down before me." 8 Jesus said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk." 9 Immediately the man became well, and picked up his pallet and began to walk.

Acts 2:44-45-44 And all the believers were together and had all things in **common**; 45 and they would sell their property and possessions and share them with all, to the extent that anyone had need.

John 12:4-6-4 But Judas Iscariot, one of His disciples, the one who intended to betray Him, said, 5 "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and *the proceeds* given to poor *people*?" 6 Now he said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief, and as he kept the money box, he used to steal from what was put into it.

Col. 4:14-Luke, the beloved **physician**, sends you his greetings, and Demas *does also*.

Luke 17:11-19-11 While He was on the way to Jerusalem, He was passing between Samaria and Galilee. 12 And as He entered a village, ten men with leprosy who stood at a distance met Him; 13 and they raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" 14 When He saw *them*, He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they were going, they were cleansed. 15 Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice, 16 and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan. 17 But Jesus responded and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine—where are they? 18 Was no one found who returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?" 19 And He said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has made you well."

Acts 2:43-Everyone kept feeling a sense of <u>awe</u>; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles.

<u>12</u>

Acts 14:11-15-8 In Lystra a man was sitting whose feet were incapacitated. He had been disabled from his mother's womb, and had never walked. This man was listening to Paul as he spoke. Paul looked at him intently and saw that he had faith to be made well, ¹⁰ and he said with a loud voice, "Stand upright on your feet!" And the man leaped up and began to walk. 11 When the crowds saw what Paul had done, they raised their voice, saying in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have become and have come down to us!" 12 And men they began calling Barnabas, Zeus, and Paul, Hermes, since he was the chief speaker. 13 Moreover, the priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates, and wanted to offer sacrifice with the crowds. 14 But when the apostles Barnabas heard about it, they tore their robes and rushed out into the crowd, crying out 15 and saying, "Men, why are you doing these things? We are also men, of the same nature as you, preaching the gospel to you, to turn from these useless things to a living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything that is in them.

Rev. 19:10-Then I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "Do not do that; I am a fellow servant of yours and your brothers and sisters who hold the testimony of Jesus;

worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."

Rev. 22:8-9-8 I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I heard and saw *them*, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who showed me these things. 9 And he said to me, "Do not do that; I am a fellow servant of yours and of your brothers the prophets, and of those who keep the words of this book. Worship God!"

Dan. 5:23-but you have risen up against the Lord of heaven; and they have brought the vessels of His house before you, and you and your nobles, your wives, and your concubines have been drinking wine out of them; and you have praised the gods of silver and gold, of bronze, iron, wood, and stone, which do not see, nor hear, nor understand. **But the God in whose hand are your lifebreath and all your ways, you have not glorified**.

John 19:15-So they shouted, "Away with *Him*, away with *Him*, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king except Caesar."

Matt. 27:25-26-25 And all the people replied, "His blood *shall be* on us and on our children!" 26 Then he released **Barabbas** for them; but after having Jesus flogged, he handed Him over to be crucified.

John 3:36-The one who believes in the Son has eternal <u>life</u>; but the one who does not obey the Son will not see <u>life</u>, but the wrath of God remains on him.

1 Cor. 2:8-the wisdom which none of the rulers of this age has **understood**; for if they had **understood** it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.

Luke 23:34- [But Jesus was saying, "<u>Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing</u>."] And they cast lots, dividing His garments among themselves.

Acts 7:60-Then he fell on his knees and cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them!" Having said this, he fell asleep.

Ps. 22:16-18-16 For dogs have surrounded me; A band of evildoers has encompassed me; They **pierced** my hands and my feet. 17 I can count all my **bones**. They look, they stare at me; 18 They divide my garments among them, And they cast **lots** for my clothing.

Isa. 53:5-But He was **pierced** for our offenses, He was crushed for our wrongdoings; The punishment for our well-being *was laid* upon Him, And by His wounds we are healed.

Zech. 12:10-And I will pour out on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and of pleading, so that they will look at Me whom they **pierced**; and they will mourn for Him, like one mourning for an only son, and they will weep bitterly over Him like the bitter weeping over a firstborn.

Matt. 19:28-And Jesus said to them, "Truly I say to you, that you who have followed Me, in the <u>regeneration</u> when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Acts 1:9-11-9 And after He had said these things, He was lifted up while they were watching, and a cloud took Him up, out of their sight. 10 And as they were gazing intently into the sky while He was going, then behold, two men in white clothing stood beside them, 11 and they said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into the sky? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you have watched Him go into heaven."

<u>22</u>

Deut. 18:15-The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your countrymen; to him you shall listen.

John 1:21-And so they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No."

<u>23</u>

Deut. 18:19-And it shall come about that whoever does not listen to My words which he speaks in My name, I Myself will require *it* of him.

1 Sam. 13:8-14-8 Now he waited for seven days, until the appointed time that Samuel had set, but Samuel did not come to Gilgal; and the people were scattering from him. 9 So Saul said, "Bring me the burnt offering and the peace offerings." And he offered the burnt offering. 10 But as soon as he finished offering the burnt offering, behold, Samuel came; and Saul went out to meet him and to greet him. 11 But Samuel said, "What have you done?" And Saul said, "Since I saw that the people were scattering from me, and that you did not come at the appointed time, and that the Philistines were assembling at Michmash, ¹² I thought, 'Now the Philistines will come down against me at Gilgal, and I have not asked the favor of the Lord.' So I worked up the courage and offered the burnt offering." 13 But Samuel said to Saul, "You have acted foolishly! You have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God, which He commanded you, for the Lord would now have established your kingdom over Israel forever. 14 But now your kingdom shall not endure. The Lord has sought for Himself a man after His own heart, and the Lord has appointed him ruler over His people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you."

Isa. 42:6-"I am the Lord, I have called You in righteousness, I will also hold You by the hand and watch over You, And I will appoint You as a covenant to the people, As a <u>light to the nations.</u>

Isa. 49:6-He says, "It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the protected ones of Israel; I will also make You a light of the nations, So that My salvation may reach to **the end of the earth**."

Deut. 7:7-The Lord did not make you His beloved nor **choose** you because you were greater in number than any of the peoples, since you were the fewest of all peoples.
