Matt. 19:28-And Jesus said to them, "Truly I say to you, that you who have followed Me, in the <u>regeneration [palingenesia]</u> when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel."

Progressive Dispensationalists interpret the "times of refreshing" in verse 19 to refer to the "already" stage of the kingdom and the "restoration of all things" in verse 21 to refer to the "not yet" stage of the kingdom. However, because the two clauses follow *hopōs* ("in order that"), are connected by *kai* ("and"), and both contain subjunctive verbs, nothing grammatically separates the two clauses. Thus, they are speaking of the same event rather than two unrelated events. Viewing both clauses as referring to the same event is strengthened upon recognizing that the plural *kairoi* ("times") in verse 19 is parallel to the plural *chronōn* (seasons or times) in verse 21. Andy Woods, *The Coming Kingdom*, 256-57.

Acts 1:9-11-9 And after He had said these things, He was <u>lifted</u> <u>up</u> while they were watching, and a <u>cloud</u> took Him up, out of their sight. 10 And as they were gazing intently into the <u>sky</u> while He was going, then behold, two men in white clothing stood beside them, 11 and they said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into the <u>sky</u>? 1 Sam. 13:8-14-8 Now he waited for seven days, until the appointed time that Samuel had set, but Samuel did not come to Gilgal; and the people were scattering from him. 9 So Saul said, "Bring me the burnt offering and the peace offerings." Isa. 42:6 - "I am the Lord, I have called You in righteousness, I will also hold You by the hand and watch over You, And I will appoint You as a covenant to the people, As a <u>light to the nations</u>.

Isa. 49:6-He says, "It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the protected ones of Israel; I will also make You a light of the nations, so that My salvation may reach to **the end of the earth**."

Deut. 7:7-The Lord did not make you His beloved nor **choose** you because you were greater in number than any of the peoples, since you were the fewest of all peoples.
