The <u>Nuzi tablets</u> are clay tablets that were discovered near Kirkuk, Iraq, in the 1920s. They date back to the mid-second millennium BC, when Nuzi was part of the Hurrian Mitanni Empire. They contain family archives and legal documents that shed light on the everyday life and customs of the Hurrians and their neighbors in Mesopotamia. Some of these customs, such as the tablets of sistership, may have parallels with the biblical Patriarchs who lived in the same region several hundred years earlier.

Ezek. 34:2-3-2 "Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel. Prophesy and say to those shepherds, 'Thus says the Lord God, "Woe, shepherds of Israel who have been feeding themselves!
