Judges 2:18-When the LORD raised up judges for them, the LORD was with the judge and delivered them from the hand of their enemies all the days of the judge; for the LORD was moved to pity by their groaning because of those who oppressed and afflicted them.

Acts 4:27- For truly in this city there were gathered together against Your holy servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both <u>Herod and Pontius Pilate</u>, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel.

Deut. 21:22-23-²² "If a man has committed a sin worthy of death and he is put to death, and you hang him on a <u>tree</u>, ²³ his corpse shall not hang all night on the <u>tree</u>, but you shall surely bury him on the same day (for he who is hanged is accursed of God), so that you do not defile your land which the LORD your God gives you as an inheritance.

Gal. 3:13-Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us—for it is written, "CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO HANGS ON A TREE"—

Acts 10:39-We are witnesses of all the things He did both in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They also put Him to death by hanging Him on a **cross**.

1 Pet. 2:24-and He Himself bore our sins in His body on the **cross**, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed.

Acts 3:15-but put to death the **Prince** of life, *the one* whom God raised from the dead, *a fact* to which we are witnesses.

Acts 3:19-21-¹⁹ Therefore <u>repent and return, so that your sins</u> <u>may be wiped away</u>, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord; ²⁰ and that He may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you, ²¹ whom heaven must receive until *the* period of restoration of all things about which God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from ancient time.

1 Cor. 15:5-7-5 and that He appeared to <u>Cephas</u>, then to the <u>twelve</u>. ⁶ After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; ⁷ then He appeared to <u>James</u>, then to all the <u>apostles</u>.

John 15:26-27-²⁶ "When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, *that is* the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will <u>testify</u> about Me, ²⁷ and you *will* <u>testify</u> also, because you have been with Me from the beginning.

1 Cor. 6:19-Or do you not know that **your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit** who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own?

Rom. 8:9-However, you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. But <u>if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Him</u>.

Eph. 4:30-Do not grieve the **Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed** for the day of redemption.

Acts 2:37-Now when they heard this, they were <u>pierced</u> to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what are we to do?"

Gen. 4:1-8- 1 Now the man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and gave birth to Cain, and she said, "I have obtained a male child with the help of the LORD." And again, she gave birth to his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of flocks, but Cain was a cultivator of the ground. ³ So it came about in the course of time that Cain brought an offering to the LORD from the fruit of the ground. ⁴ Abel, on his part also brought an offering, from the firstborn of his flock and from their fat portions. And the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering; 5 but for Cain and his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very angry and his face was gloomy. ⁶ Then the LORD said to Cain, "Why are you angry? And why is your face gloomy? If you do well, will your face not be cheerful? And if you do not do well, sin is lurking at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it." 8 Cain talked to his brother Abel; and it happened that when they were in the field Cain rose up against his brother Abel and killed him.

- 1 John 3:1-12-not as <u>Cain, who was of the evil one and murdered his brother</u>. And for what reason did he murder him? Because his own deeds were evil, but his brother's were righteous.
- 2 Sam. 12:1-5- ¹ Then the LORD sent Nathan to David. And he came to him and said, "There were two men in one city, the one rich and the other poor. ² "The rich man had a great many flocks and herds. ³ "But the poor man had nothing except one little ewe lamb Which he bought and nourished; And it grew up together with him and his children. It would eat of his bread and drink of his cup and lie in his bosom And was like a daughter to him. ⁴ "Now a traveler came to the rich man, And he was unwilling to take from his own flock or his own herd, To prepare for the wayfarer who had come to him; Rather he took the poor man's ewe lamb and prepared it for the man who had come to him." ⁵ Then David's <u>anger burned greatly</u> against the man, and he said to Nathan, "As the LORD lives, surely the man who has done this deserves to <u>die</u>.

John 12:10-But the chief priests planned to put Lazarus to <u>death</u> also.

John 8:58-59-⁵⁸ Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was born, I am." ⁵⁹ Therefore **they picked up stones to throw at Him**, but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple.

Acts 22:3-I am a Jew, born in Tarsus of Cilicia, but brought up in this city, <u>educated under Gamaliel</u>, strictly according to the law of our fathers, being zealous for God just as you all are today.

John 3:10- Jesus answered and said to him, "Are you <u>the teacher</u> of Israel and do not understand these things?

Luke 2:46-Then, after three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of **the teachers**, both listening to them and asking them questions.

Luke 5:17-One day He was teaching; and there were some **Pharisees and teachers of the law** sitting there, who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem; and the power of the Lord was present for Him to perform healing.

Acts 2:41-so then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added **about** three thousand souls.

Acts 4:17-18-¹⁷ But so that it will not spread any further among the people, let us warn them to **speak no longer** to any man in this name." ¹⁸ And when they had summoned them, they commanded them **not to speak or teach** at all in the name of Jesus.

Deut. 25:2-3-2 then it shall be if the wicked man deserves to be beaten, the judge shall then make him lie down and be beaten in his presence with the number of stripes according to his guilt. ³ He may beat him **forty times but no more**, so that he does not beat him with many more stripes than these and your brother is not degraded in your eyes.

2 Cor. 11:24-Five times I received from the Jews <u>thirty-nine lashes</u>.

Luke 20:35-but those who are considered **worthy** to attain to that age and the resurrection from the dead, neither marry nor are given in marriage.

2 Thess. 1:5-This is a plain indication of God's righteous judgment so that you will be considered **worthy** of the kingdom of God, for which indeed you are suffering.

Acts 16:22-25- ²² The crowd rose up together against them, and the chief magistrates tore their robes off them and proceeded to order *them* to be beaten with rods. ²³ When they had struck them with many blows, they threw them into prison, commanding the jailer to guard them securely; ²⁴ and he, having received such a

command, threw them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks. ²⁵ But about midnight <u>Paul and Silas were praying</u> <u>and singing hymns of praise to God</u>, and the prisoners were listening to them.
