Gen. 47:28-Jacob lived in the land of <u>Egypt seventeen years</u>; so the length of Jacob's life was <u>one hundred and forty-seven</u> <u>years</u>.

Gen. 47:4-They said to Pharaoh, "We have come to <u>sojourn</u> in the land, for there is no pasture for your servants' flocks, for the famine is severe in the land of Canaan. Now, therefore, please let your servants live in the land of Goshen."

1 Pet. 1:17-If you address as Father the One who impartially judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves in fear during the time of your <u>stay on earth</u>.

Ps. 103:15-16-<sup>15</sup> As for man, his days are like **grass**; As a **flower** of the field, so he flourishes. <sup>16</sup> When the wind has passed over it, it is no more, and its place acknowledges it no longer.

Jas. 4:14-Yet you do not know what your life will be like tomorrow. You are just a <u>vapor</u> that appears for a little while and then vanishes away.

Eccles. 1:2- "<u>Vanity of vanities</u>," says the Preacher, "<u>Vanity of</u> <u>vanities</u>! All is vanity."
