Gen. 34:25-26-<sup>25</sup> Now it came about on the third day, when they were in pain, that two of Jacob's sons, Simeon and Levi, Dinah's brothers, each took his sword and came upon the city unawares, and <u>killed every male</u>.<sup>26</sup> They killed Hamor and his son Shechem with the edge of the sword, and took Dinah from Shechem's house, and went forth.

Exod. 21:24-25-<sup>24</sup> eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, <sup>25</sup> burn for burn, wound for wound, bruise for bruise.

Gen. 48:22-I give you one portion more than your brothers, which I took from the hand of the Amorite with **my sword and my bow**.

Prov. 6:16-17-<sup>16</sup> There are six things which the Lord hates, yes, seven which are an abomination to Him: <sup>17</sup> Haughty eyes, a lying tongue, and <u>hands that shed innocent blood</u>.

# <u>6</u>

Gen. 34:30-Then Jacob said to Simeon and Levi, "<u>You</u> <u>have brought trouble on me by making me odious among the</u> <u>inhabitants of the land</u>, among the Canaanites and the Perizzites; and my men being few in number, they will gather together against me and attack me and I will be destroyed, I and my household."

2 Cor. 6:14-16-<sup>14</sup> <u>**Do not be bound together with unbelievers**</u>; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness? <sup>15</sup> Or what harmony has Christ with Belial, or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever? <sup>16</sup> Or what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God; just as God said, "I will dwell in them and walk among them; And I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

Gen. 34:27-28-<sup>27</sup> Jacob's sons came upon the slain and looted the city, because they had defiled their sister. <sup>28</sup> They took their <u>flocks</u> and their herds and their donkeys, and that which was in the city and that which was in the field.

Deut. 22:6-7-<sup>6</sup>"If you happen to come upon a <u>bird's nest</u> along the way, in any tree or on the ground, with young ones or eggs, and the mother sitting on the young or on the eggs, you shall not take the mother with the young; <sup>7</sup> you shall certainly let the mother go, but the young you may take for yourself, in order that it may be well with you and that you may prolong your days.

Deut. 25:4-You shall not <u>muzzle the ox</u> while he is threshing.

Prov. 12:10-<u>A righteous man has regard for the life of his</u> <u>animal</u>, but *even* the compassion of the wicked is cruel.

Matt. 6:26-Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and *yet* your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not **worth much more** than they?

Matt. 12:12-How much **more valuable** then is a man than a sheep! So then, it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.

Eph. 4:26-27-<sup>26</sup> Be angry, and *yet* do not sin; <u>do not let the sun</u> <u>go down on your anger</u>, <sup>27</sup> and do not give the devil an opportunity. Eph. 4:32-Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, <u>forgiving each</u> <u>other</u>, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you.

Prov. 16:32-He who is **<u>slow to anger</u>** is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city.

Prov. 22:24-25-<sup>24</sup> Do not associate with a man *given* to a<u>nger</u>; Or go with a <u>hot-tempered</u> man, <sup>25</sup> Or you will learn his ways And find a <u>snare</u> for yourself.

Gen. 4:5-8-<sup>5</sup> but for Cain and for his offering He had no regard. So Cain became very <u>angry</u> and his countenance fell.<sup>6</sup> Then the Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry? And why has your countenance fallen? <sup>7</sup> If you do well, will not *your countenance* be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it." <sup>8</sup> Cain told Abel his brother. And it came about when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother and <u>killed him</u>.

## <u>8</u>

2 Sam. 22:41-"You have also made my enemies <u>turn their backs</u> to me, And I destroyed those who hated me.

Ps. 18:40-You have also made my enemies <u>turn their backs</u> to me, And I destroyed those who hated me.

Gen. 37:26-27-<sup>26</sup> Judah said to his brothers, "What profit is it for us to <u>kill</u> our brother and cover up his blood? <sup>27</sup> Come and let us <u>sell</u> him to the Ishmaelites and not lay our hands on him, for he is our brother, our *own* flesh." And his brothers listened *to him*. Rev. 3:9-Behold, I will cause those of the synagogue of Satan, who say that they are Jews and are not, but lie—I will make them come and bow down at your feet, and make them know that I have loved you.

## <u>10</u>

Isa 2:2-3-<sup>2</sup> Now it will come about that In the last days The mountain of the house of the LORD Will be established as the chief of the mountains, And will be raised <u>above</u> the hills; And all the nations will stream to it.<sup>3</sup> And many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, To the house of the God of Jacob; That He may teach us concerning His ways And that we may walk in His paths."<u>For the law will go forth from</u> <u>Zion And the word of the LORD from Jerusalem</u>.

Isa 49:22-23-Thus says the Lord GOD, "Behold, I will lift up My hand to <u>the nations</u> And set up My standard to the peoples; And they will bring your sons in *their* bosom, And your daughters will be carried on *their* shoulders.<sup>23</sup> "Kings will be your guardians, And their princesses your nurses. <u>They will bow down to you with their faces to the earth And lick the dust of your feet</u>; And *you* will know that I am the LORD; Those who hopefully wait for Me will not be put to shame.

## Zech. 8:23-Thus says the LORD of hosts, 'In those days <u>ten men</u> <u>from all the nations will grasp the garment of a Jew, saying,</u> <u>"Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you.</u>"

Rev. 20:9- And they came up on the broad plain of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and <u>the beloved city</u>, and fire came down from heaven and devoured them.

1 Pet. 3:15-but <u>sanctify Christ as Lord</u> in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence.

### <u>11</u>

Isa. 63:1-6- <sup>4</sup>Who is this who comes from Edom, With garments of glowing colors from Bozrah, This One who is majestic in His apparel, Marching in the greatness of His strength? "It is I who speak in righteousness, mighty to save." <sup>2</sup>Why is Your apparel red, And Your garments like the one who treads in the wine press? <sup>3</sup>"I have trodden the wine trough alone, And from the peoples there was no man with Me. I also trod them in My anger And trampled them in My wrath; And their lifeblood is sprinkled on My garments, And I stained all My raiment. <sup>4</sup>"For the day of vengeance was in My heart, And My year of redemption has come. <sup>5</sup>"I looked, and there was no one to help, And I was astonished and there was no one to uphold; So My own arm brought salvation to Me, And My wrath upheld Me. <sup>6</sup>"I trod down the peoples in My anger And made them drunk in My wrath, And I poured out their lifeblood on the earth."

Rev. 14:17-20-<sup>17</sup> And another angel came out of the temple which is in heaven, and he also had a sharp sickle. <sup>18</sup> Then another angel, the one who has power over fire, came out from the altar; and he called with a loud voice to him who had the sharp sickle, saying, "Put in your sharp sickle and gather the clusters from the vine of the earth, because her grapes are ripe." <sup>19</sup> So the angel swung his sickle to the earth and gathered *the clusters from* the vine of the earth, and threw them into the great wine press of the wrath of God. <sup>20</sup> And the wine press was trodden outside the city, and blood came out from the wine press, up to the horses' bridles, for a distance of two hundred miles.

Rev. 1:14-15-<sup>14</sup> His head and His hair were white like white wool, like snow; and His <u>eves</u> were like a flame of fire. <sup>15</sup> His feet *were* like burnished bronze, when it has been made to glow in a furnace, and His voice *was* like the sound of many waters.
