<u>11:30</u>

1 Tim. 3:8-Deacons likewise *must be* men of dignity, <u>**not**</u> doubletongued, or addicted to much wine or <u>**fond of sordid gain**</u>.

Acts 20:17-From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called to him the <u>elders</u> of the church.

1 Tim 4:14-Do not neglect the spiritual gift within you, which was bestowed on you through prophetic utterance with the laying on of hands by the **presbytery**.

1 Tim. 4:14 (NKJV)-Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you by prophecy with the laying on of the hands of the <u>eldership</u>.

1 Tim. 5:17-The <u>elders</u> who rule well are to be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who work hard at preaching and teaching.

1 Tim. 5:19-Do not receive an accusation against an <u>elder</u> except on the basis of two or three witnesses.

Titus 1:5-For this reason I left you in Crete, that you would set in order what remains and appoint <u>elders</u> in every city as I directed you.

1 Peter 5:1-4-Therefore, I exhort the <u>elders</u> among you, as *your* fellow elder and witness of the sufferings of Christ, and a partaker also of the glory that is to be revealed, ² shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to *the will of* God; and not for sordid gain, but with eagerness; ³ nor yet as lording it over those allotted to your charge, but proving to be examples to the flock. ⁴And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.

6:1-7-Now at this time while the disciples Acts were increasing in number, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic Jews against the native Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food. ² So <u>the twelve</u> summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables.³ Therefore, brethren, select from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. ⁴But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." ⁵ The found statement approval with the whole congregation; and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch. ⁶ And these they brought before the apostles; and after praying, they laid their hands on them.⁷ The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Matt. 17:1-Six days later Jesus took with Him Peter and James and John his brother and led them up on a high mountain by themselves.

Matt. 20:20-23-²⁰ Then the <u>mother of the sons of Zebedee</u> came to Jesus with her sons, bowing down and making a request of

Him. ²¹ And He said to her, "What do you wish?" She *said to Him, "Command that in Your kingdom these two sons of mine may sit one on Your right and one on Your left." ²² But Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?" They said to Him, "We are able." ²³ He said to them, "<u>My cup you shall drink</u>; but to sit on My right and on *My* left, this is not Mine to give, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by My Father."
