A. WE SHOULD PTL BECAUSE OF HIS <u>GREATNESS</u>! (VV. 1-3)

- in v. 4, we are told that we should '<u>declare</u>' truth about the Lord;
- in v. 5, that we should 'meditate' upon his character;
- in v. 6, that we should '<u>speak</u>' or '<u>declare</u>' things about him;
- in v.7, that we should '<u>utter</u>' or '<u>sing</u>' truth about him and to him;
- in v. 12, that we should 'make known' his character and his goodness to others around us;
- in v. 18 that we should '<u>call upon Him</u>';
- in v. 19, that we should '<u>fear him</u>'; and
- in v. 20, that we should 'love him'.

SO, WHY SHOULD WE PRAISE THE LORD?


We should praise the Lord:

- because of His unceasing goodness! (vv. 4-10), and...








Psalm 66:18 (NKJV) If I regard iniquity in my heart, The Lord will not hear.






